- 2. Presentation by ISSO (David Austell)
 - a. Hiring four additional staff
 - i. International population at Columbia rapidly growing, 8.7% 2018-19
 - ii. 16,000 international students, 12,000 full time
 - iii. 3,000 international faculty members
 - iv. New hires will mean 1 advisor:1,100 students

3. Presentation by CUFSN (William Veitch)

- a. William is a senior at School of General Studies, father of two, and President of Columbia University Family Support Network
 - i. CUFSN runs events for everyone on campus, including undergraduates, graduate students, and faculty with families

- c. Q&A:
 - i. How would student volunteers be organized?
 - There would have to be an application process, student would have to have some experience at summer camp, teaching kids. They would have to be vetted in some way. But the parents and child would not be separated at any time. This is also a way to integrate students with families with students without families. Also a good opportunity for students who want babysitting opportunities.
